

For over 100 years, since Scouting began in 1910, its variety of programs has helped youngsters to succeed and provided a lifetime of memories. Scouting has instilled values, built confidence and taught skills that have not only helped in daily life. As reported in recent disasters, Scouts also know how to save lives and help those in need.

Your contribution to the Endowment Fund makes a difference. It helps to provide not only a sound financial base for future generations of Scouting but also for those additional programs now that could not exist on the operating budget alone. The Council is constantly striving to:

- Increase and improve camping and program activities.
- Expand outreach programs
- Improve service to districts and units.
- Improve communications.
- Have the ability to continue financially providing Scouting programs in a down year or through a disaster.

Only the investment income is expensed, the principal provides income into perpetuity.

Last year approximately eight thousand youth benefited from Scouting and Learning for Life programs. None of these programs would be possible without the support of over 2,500 registered leaders. Each year 5% of the operating budget is provided directly from the support of Scouting families. The remainder of the \$1.6 million budget is derived from special events, popcorn sales, trading post sales, activities and endowment investment income (5%).

TAX SAVINGS BENEFITS

In addition to the benefits to Scouting by a gift to the endowment, the donor will benefit from a tax savings. * E.g. donors in the 25% tax bracket pledging a 1910 Society gift of \$25,000 paid over 5 years, will represent a cost of appx \$3,750 per year once the charitable deduction has been taken. Based on an annual interest rate of 8% the total gift of \$25,000 { æ generate \$2,000 each year for Scouting **forever**.
